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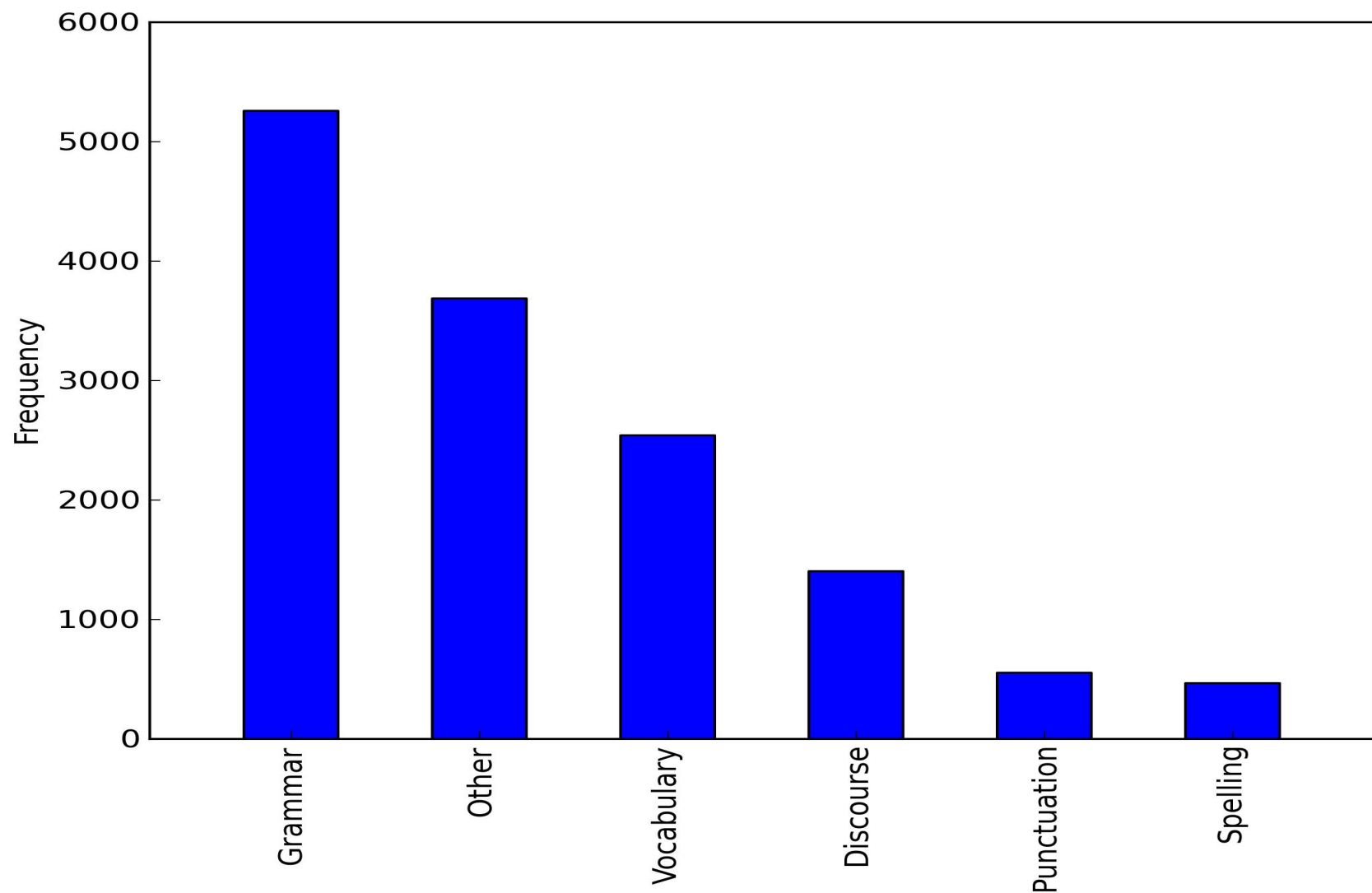
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REALEC

(Russian Error-Annotated Learner English Corpus)

- <http://realec.org>
- Composed of English essays written by native Russian speakers.
- Errors encountered in essays are annotated.
- Annotation deploys 4 tiers of information about a particular error.
- Supplied with morphological annotation

Distribution of error types in REALEC



Novelty and timeliness

- Few learner corpora with Russian speakers' data.
- None of such corpora available online.
- The necessity of tuning language teaching to the needs of learners



- REALEC's aim:
 - to integrate data-driven methods into language teaching;
 - to create opportunity to study Russian-English interlanguage.

Applications and implications

Educational:

- Knowledge about problematic grammar patterns among Russian learners.
- Corpus-based grammar and grammar exercises.
- Automatic assessment of students' works.

Theoretical:

- Comparing Russian-English interlanguage to interlanguages with other L1 backgrounds.
- Attempt to define the notion of error in learner's language.
